PURPOSE

• To develop an appreciation of the interrelatedness of languages and other cultures through the learning of another language other than English.

POLICY GUIDELINES

- All government primary schools are expected to teach a language other than English.
- At KEPS Italian is taught from Foundation to Year 6.
- Italian is taught to develop communication skills in speaking and writing; and to enhance linguistic and literacy skills. The Language program also develops an appreciation of the Italian language and culture and its contribution to our society.
- Learning a language demonstrates the interrelatedness of languages and culture and builds students' selfexpression and sense of achievement.
- Language is an important and legitimate part of the learning experiences of Australian children.
- The isolated nature of Australia precludes many Australian students from experiencing a variety of cultures.
 Learning a language other than English, enhances cross-cultural communication and improves students' knowledge of customs, history, geography, literature and the arts. Students become aware and tolerant of the lives of people from diverse background.
- A comprehensive language program, based on the Victorian Curriculum is implemented by the language teacher for students from F-6.
- The language classes, wherever possible, reinforce and support the integrated curriculum.
- The language teacher will be responsible for the development of the school language policy, program and assessment and reporting.
- The Victorian Curriculum forms the basis when planning, implementing and evaluating the language program in the mid and end of year reports.
- The language teacher establishes the standards appropriate at each level that progress to the standards documented in the Victorian Curriculum. In accordance with the Victorian Curriculum, progression points are given to students from F-6 in the mid and end of year written reports.

POLICY IMPLEMENTATION

- All students receive 1x 50 minute language lesson weekly by a specialist language teacher.
- The language teacher will be responsible for the administration and provision of resources and equipment.
- Students experience the language in the classroom where the lesson is communicated in Italian and the visual aids, including the interactive whiteboard, iPads and computers, engage and motivate students.
- Students have access to computers, the interactive whiteboard and iPads for cultural and language
 activities and to facilitate enjoyment and appreciation of the language.
- ICT is used to support the Language program where appropriate.
- Sequential lessons are created for each level using the Victorian Curriculum. Activities include singing, speaking, listening, writing, interactive games and role plays.
- The language teacher will investigate and purchase current resources to support the teaching of Italian.
- Wherever possible, the integrated curriculum will be incorporated into the Language program. All children
 will be given the opportunity to learn and express themselves using a wide variety of media and
 resources.
- Students are encouraged to work collaboratively and to develop the use of Thinking Tools.
- Languages are reported on each semester for all students from F-6. A progression point and comment are given in the mid and end of year reports.

EVALUATION

The Languages policy will be reviewed every 4 years as per the policy schedule or as required.
